The count of the ASTA members attending the meeting was 72.

President Long requested everyone to stand and join in the pledge of allegiance to the flag. President Long requested a motion to approve the minutes from last years meeting, March 29, 2015. Kristi Williams made the motion for approval of the minutes and George Miller seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous to approve the minutes. President Long thanked Celeste Robb and Mary Long for all of their hard work at the trophy desk all week.

Ken Schatz gave the Treasures report stating that the ASTA was once again on sound ground with a total amount of money in all accounts of \$170,887.11. Ken informed the members that the ASTA was responsible for three shoots a year. One being the Western Zone Held in July at Tucson. The cost for this shoot was \$6,640.00. The second shoot was the Hall of Fame shoot which is two shoots in one. The Hall of Fame and the Zone Challenge. Cost for the two held Oct 23-25 at Ben Avery was \$7,365.39.

The third shoot being the State Shoot this year with a cost of \$43,480.83. The treasurer gave a cash breakdown on the cost of the shoot referring to program cost, mailing, pins, target buy down, and dinner. This information was posted on the bulletin board. The treasurer explained the cost per day for hard trophies and cash prizes. The treasurer informed the group the cost for runner-up prizes for the Championship events was \$1,440.00.

The treasurer explained to the ASTA members that the BOD get a monthly scan of the Bank Account statement from Chase so everyone knows how much we are worth at all times.

The treasurer explained why we do not want to buy Sub Jr., Junior, or Jr. Gold trophies because we do not know how many are going to show up at a shoot. The board has decided to give cash prizes to that category of winners.

Tiger Volz asked the question on the ATA rebate given to the State of Arizona this year. The treasurer informed the members the amount was \$13,194. A breakdown of that amount was \$1,077 Member Dues, \$1,038 Life Member Rebate, and \$11,099 Fees Rebate. Arizona ranked number 4 in the entire ATA.

Raylene Junkins made a motion to accept the Treasurers report and seconded by Mark Williams. Vote taken was unanimous to approve.

President Long opened the meeting up to questions from the floor.

Michael Luchetta applauded the BOD for all of the effort they put forth to have a successful State Shoot. Michael stated that what he and others wanted most was that Championship Doubles Event be moved back to Sunday of the State Shoot. Argument being, people who could not take off from work and the Juniors did not want to forfeit a school day.

Tim Robb addressed the request to move doubles to Sunday with several reasons to keep it on Friday. The three main reasons being: when do we have the State Meeting, recognition of the State Team members and others, third; the shoot offs on Sunday night can be a nightmare with pressure on the trophy desk Sunday night.

Kristi Williams made the comment that she agreed with Tim Robb, that people who are traveling want to get out early and not late Sunday night.

Clyde Thompson made a suggestion that we have the Doubles last event on Friday. Have our awards dinner Friday night and on Sunday morning have our business meeting.

Sherry Schatz had a suggestion that we have the State Meeting on Saturday between the two hundred singles and the Doubles and Handicap on Sunday, starting Doubles at 8:00 am.

Paul Doetsch agreed that the meeting should be held during the turn on Saturday during the two hundred singles.

A hand count was taken of the group attending the meeting on who wanted the Doubles on Sunday verses Friday. The majority of shooters wanted the Doubles on Sunday, just four opposed Sunday.

George Miller suggested that the BOD be shown special treatment in Pre Squading for the State Shoot. This idea was rejected by the BOD.

At this time State Team members were announced informing all that State Team members would receive jackets plus the plates and plaques.

At this time ATA Delegate John Bergman made the presentation to the Rookie of the Year, who is Sarah Schrade.

The meeting floor was open for nominations for Directors positions. Jim Grider nominated Steve Long for the North position this was seconded by John Bergman. Tim Robb cast the ballot for Steve Long to make his election official.

For the Southern Directors position Richard Lane nominated Doug Sims. This was seconded by Marty Benko. Marty Benko cast the ballot for Doug Sims to make his election official.

David Nortrup nominated Mark Williams for Director of the Central Zone, seconded by Jay Alterman. Sherry Schatz nominated Tiger Volz for Director of the Central Zone, seconded by Michael Luchetta.

Both Mark Williams and Tiger Volz gave presentations on why they wanted to represent the Central Zone as a Director.

The floor was opened for nominations for ATA Delegate. Frank Teichman nominated John Bergman. This was second by Tiger Volz. Ken Schatz cast the ballot for John Bergman. John Bergman ran unopposed.

The floor was opened for nominations for ATA Alternate Delegate. Sherry Schatz nominated Tiger Volz. This was seconded by John Bergman. Dusty McWilliams nominated Jim Bob Davis and was seconded by Mark Williams.

Both Tiger and Jim gave presentations on why they wanted to be the Alternate Delegate.

Jesse Zamora made a motion to close the nominations and this was seconded by George Miller.  
The elections results for the Central Zone Directors position was Mark Williams (29) Tiger Volz (20)  
with Mark Williams being elected.

The election results for the Alternate Delegate position was Tiger Volz (35) Jim Bob Davis (25) Tiger  
Volz being elected.
